

North-South Intelligent Transportation System Deployment Project


Fair Oaks Avenue Between Huntington Drive and Columbia Street

Project Limits:

• Fair Oaks Avenue from Huntington Drive to Columbia Street

Scope:

- Upgrade the traffic signal system along the Fair Oaks Avenue corridor to include various elements of Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) in order to enhance vehicular traffic circulation, improve pedestrian and bicycle travels, and provide overall traffic signal compatibility with the Regional Integration of Intelligent Transportation Systems (RIITS) program.
- A total of 15 intersections included.
- Other elements of the project:
 - Fiber optic installation
 - Street closure
 - Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB)
 - ADA curb ramp upgrades
 - Medians and median nose enhancements
 - · Curb extension and landscaping
 - Irrigation system



Fair Oaks Avenue Between Huntington Drive and Columbia Street

Project Funding:

- Total Cost = \$10,554,120:
 - \$9,343,563 from FHWA Rogan Funds (funds expire 6/30/27)
 - o \$1,210,557 City match
- Current rough order of magnitude estimate for construction is \$8,379,900 (Based on 50% design)
- For design \$1,137,574 (includes a \$103,416 contingency)

Fair Oaks Avenue Between Huntington Drive and Columbia Street

Schedule:


- 50% plans received Friday August 15, 2025
- City comments due Friday, August 29, 2025
- 90% plans due September 19, 2025
- Environmental documentation complete by October 24, 2025
- Final review comments due November 3, 2025
- 100% design due November 27, 2025
- Construction completion by June 30, 2027 (funding deadline)




Project Highlights

1. Fiber Optic Installation:

A fiber optic cable be installed will from City Hall to the PW Garfield Yard using existing conduit on the south side Mission from City Hall to Fair Oaks Ave. and a new 4" conduit From Fair Oaks to the Garfield Building








Fair Oaks Avenue Between Huntington Drive and Columbia Street

Project Highlights

- 2. Grevelia Street Closure at intersection of Fair Oaks Avenue:
- ❖ Grevelia Street will be permanently closed and becomes as a Cul-de-Sac at Fair Oaks Ave. This is needed to prevent conflicting right turn movements from the freeway ramp and enhance pedestrian crossing from the east and west approaches of the intersection.





Fair Oaks Avenue Between Huntington Drive and Columbia Street


Project Highlights

3. Fair Oaks Avenue at Huntington Drive Modifications:

The intersection of Fair Oaks at Huntington Drive will be addressed in the Fremont-Huntington Improvement project based on the recommendations brought in the Toole Report. As such, N-S ITS project elements at this intersection are kept to a minimum. Improvements include installation of bike lane intersection delineation to assist bicyclists to cross the intersection and high-visibility "Ladder-Type" crosswalks.








Fair Oaks Avenue Between Huntington Drive and Columbia Street

Project Highlights

4. Fair Oaks Avenue at Spruce Street:

The intersection of Fair Oaks Avenue and Spruce Street will be restriped to provide better visibility of pedestrians in the crosswalk. Furthermore, a new solar-powered Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) will be installed on the north approach of the intersection complete with new pedestrian crossing signs and high-visibility, ladder-type crosswalk.






Fair Oaks Avenue Between Huntington Drive and Columbia Street

Project Highlights

5. ADA Curb Ramp Improvements (Continued):

- At some locations where there are two separate curb ramps, these curb ramps will be combined into one ramp. Those locations are:
 - Fair Oaks Avenue and Hope Street
 - Fair Oaks Avenue and Mission Street
 - Fair Oaks Avenue and El Centro Street
 - Fair Oaks Avenue and Oxley Street
- Other locations were ADA curb ramps are upgraded, include:
 - o Fair Oaks Avenue and Columbia Street
 - o Fair Oaks Avenue and State Street
 - Fair Oaks Avenue and Lyndon Street





Project Highlights

6. Median Nose Modifications:

Some intersection median noses along Fair Oaks Avenue will be modified to align the left turn pocket. The modifications will include narrowing the existing median noses to 2 ft. – 3 ft. and widen the opposite left turn pockets to 11 ft. – 12 ft. so they can be aligned.

- Median noses are being modified at the following intersections:
 - 1. Fair Oaks Avenue at Lyndon Street
 - 2. Fair Oaks Avenue at Bank Street
 - 3. Fair Oaks Avenue at Rollin Street
 - 4. Fair Oaks Avenue at Oak Street
 - 5. Fair Oaks Avenue at Laurel Street
 - 6. Fair Oaks Avenue at Spruce Street
 - 7. Fair Oaks Avenue at Huntington Drive






Project Highlights

7. Curb extension (bulb-out) removal:

- Curb extension (bulb-out) removal is proposed at the following locations:
 - 1. Hope Street at Fair Oaks Avenue eastbound (SW corner).
 - 2. Hope Street at Fair Oaks Avenue westbound (NE corner)
 - 3. Mission Street at Fair Oaks Street eastbound (SW corner)
 - 4. El Centro Street at Fair Oaks Avenue eastbound (SW corner)
 - 5. El Centro Street at Fair Oaks Avenue westbound (NE corner)
 - 6. Oxley Street at Fair Oaks Avenue eastbound (SW corner)
 - 7. Oxley Street at Fair Oaks Avenue westbound (NE corner)
- ❖ The bulb-outs are being removed only on the approach side for east-west streets to reduce being struck by vehicles and to reduce delay for side street traffic. No bulb-outs on Fair Oaks Avenue are being removed.







Project Highlights

8. Irrigation and Landscape:

- New landscape planters along with an irrigation system will be installed where there is an existing or proposed new curb extension. The purpose of the planters is to heighten motorists awareness of the presence of a curb extension to avoid running over the curb extension. The planters will provide an additional layer of protection for pedestrians on the sidewalk waiting to cross the street. The planters will be installed at the following intersections:
 - 1. Fair Oaks Avenue and Hope Street NW & SE Corners
 - 2. Fair Oaks Avenue and Mission Street NW Corner
 - 3. Fair Oaks Avenue and El Centro Street NW Corner
 - 4. Fair Oaks Avenue and Oxley Street NW Corner
 - 5. Fair Oaks Avenue and Monterey Road NW & NE Corners
 - 6. New Irrigation System on Fair Oaks Avenue Median at Rollin Street
