Re: Investigate South Pasadena Chief of Police for Ties to Hate Group

Dear Mayor Joe and Councilmembers:

We submit this letter of concern as organizations representing residents of South Pasadena and organizations advocating for the civil rights of our communities. We demand a formal investigation from the City Council into the recent decision of the Chief of Police to approve and promote a public event led by a local chapter of the American Society for the Defense of Tradition, Family, and Property, scheduled to be held at the South Pasadena Police Department station on Saturday, September 26, at 10:00 am. This letter also serves as a personnel complaint against Chief Ortiz submitted under Section 320.2.2. of the [South Pasadena Police Department Policies and Procedures Manual](#).

Chief Joe Ortiz sent an email, with the subject line, "Invitation to all," to undisclosed recipients on September 24, 2020, at around 2:55 pm. Chief Ortiz described the event as "an excellent opportunity to meet with some of our community members who want to show their support and publicly recognize all first responders and the excellent work we do." Chief Ortiz noted that, "please know that our uniformed personnel are not in attendance to endorse, support, oppose or contradict any political campaign, initiative, social issue, cause, or religion. ***Please refrain from using photos of our personnel as we welcome the community's spiritual support.***"

That evening, at around 5:58 pm, Chief Ortiz sent an email to several city email inboxes and individuals informing them that the event "has been postponed until further notice."

The next day, the City Manager's office issued a statement from Chief Ortiz apologizing for his actions. Chief Ortiz stated: "My error in judgment was the result of good intentions, albeit with poor execution. I deeply regret that my lack of due diligence in this matter has caused confusion and doubt about the many great qualities of our community that make it so special."

Chief Ortiz's invitation of a group espousing racism, bigotry and xenophobia to gather on city property is a breach of our trust and confidence. At a minimum, the City Council must investigate this incident. The American Society for the Defense of Tradition, Family, and Property (TFP) is a religiously-affiliated organization that promotes hate ideology, speech, and actions. On their website, TFP has a page dedicated to "Pray for Your Police Department." On that same page, TFP suggests the disproportionate number of Black lives killed during police encounters is justified.^[1] The TFP website contains numerous articles denouncing Black Lives Matter protests,^[2] the movement for racial justice,^[3] and public health measures taken during this COVID-19 pandemic.^[4] TFP's articles call the coronavirus "the Chinese virus."^[5] They characterize community-based organizations and leaders "mythical" and indigenous communities and communities of color as "not exist[ing] as unified social units."^[6] The Southern Poverty Law Center describes TFP as a "virulently anti-LGBT group."^[7]

Chief Ortiz's claim that he was unaware of the hateful views TFP prominently displays on its website defies credulity. What kind of diligence Chief Ortiz did exercise in sanctioning the TFP event? If Chief Ortiz did not know that

TFP promotes positions at odds with South Pasadena’s inclusive values, why did he caution attendees not to take photos of officers and staff taking part in the prayer? What misuse of public funds, public property, and email systems occurred? Do these actions amount to violations of the department’s own policies and state laws? Is this misconduct subject to discipline?

Chief Ortiz’s invitation to host TFP at the police department must be examined in context. Since May of this year, South Pasadena Youth for Police Reform and Black Lives Matter South Pasadena have been demonstrating on our streets calling for police reform and justice for the Black lives lost to police brutality. The Anti-Racism Committee of South Pasadena held a listening session with the police department and the City Council to share their personal experiences of biased and unequal treatment by police officers. Care First South Pasadena has called for our city leaders to critically examine the police budget. These public demands for police reform are occurring front and center in our city and in cities throughout our country. While our views may differ on the specifics of police reform, we share one vision: a community that respects the dignity and safety of all people. And when we dissent, we do so respectfully—not with hate.

Chief Ortiz’s decision to align the police department with TFP has harmed our community. As such, the City Council must act swiftly to investigate this incident. We request that this incident be discussed as an agenda item at the next City Council meeting on **October 7 or at a special meeting called by the council**. Should there be costs to complete an investigation, Councilmembers may consider using their discretionary district funds to supplement some of these costs.

This City Council passed [Resolution 7673](#) in August 2020 affirming the city’s commitment to safeguarding the civil rights, safety, and dignity of all our residents and to *proactively* ensure our rights and privileges. The city has pledged to not tolerate any acts of discrimination motivated by hatred toward any group based on race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, or gender identity. The City Council should act on this resolution and uphold the policies and laws that govern our city. For these reasons, we call on the City Council to investigate this matter fully, with transparency, and with a complete report back to the public.

We would appreciate the inclusion of the public comment below for tonight's City Council meeting on October 7. Thank you.

Dear City Manager, City Council, and Public Safety Commission of South Pasadena,

The Anti-Racism Committee (ARC) of South Pasadena is a grass-roots organization committed to addressing the deep wounds of systemic racism in our city as well as working towards racial justice in government policy, public safety, education, housing, art, and community services, among others. ARC works in partnership with all community stakeholders in order to help foster accountability, equity, restorative justice, and empathic exchange. We are writing this letter to you to express our deep concern about a pattern of violence directed towards Black Lives Matter protestors in our city and the negligence of the South Pasadena Police Department. This pattern needs to stop.

On Saturday, October 3, 2020 at approximately 1:40 pm, a white male South Pasadena resident, Richard Cheney drove his Ram 1800 truck across opposing traffic and onto the sidewalk on the southwest corner of Fair Oaks and Mission. His truck stopped just one foot away from the metal barrier in front of Starbucks, nearly hitting Black Lives Matter protestors. Fortunately, the protestors and nearby pedestrians were not hurt. Cheney was also heard yelling from his open window, "So, you're gonna keep putting those signs up?" His dangerous maneuver was intended to intimidate and threaten Black Lives Matter protestors. Police were called. The watch commander who never came to the scene and the supervisor on duty who arrived after witnesses were interviewed, both came to the conclusion that they would not arrest or cite Cheney. The entire time, Richard Cheney refused to wear a mask and was eventually let go. Despite eyewitness accounts and videos documenting what happened, no arrests were made, and no citations were given. The South Pasadena Police Department has issued a news release on October 3, 2020 that "[t]he case will be presented to the District Attorney for filing considerations."

The Anti-Racism Committee of South Pasadena condemns this violent and dangerous act. We are also frustrated with repeated inaction and lack of accountability of the South Pasadena Police Department to protect and serve our community, particularly our marginalized community members that include our Black and Latinx residents. During a time when protestors rightfully exercise their First Amendment right to free speech and peaceful assembly to support Black lives, we have also witnessed horrible incidents of counter-protestors who retaliate by driving their vehicles through crowds to intentionally harm Black Lives Matter supporters. What happened last Saturday afternoon echoes the intent of these egregious acts, and what is not acceptable is that there were no consequences whatsoever for Richard Cheney.

More importantly, the incident involving Richard Cheney is by no means an isolated incident. Fahren James, one of the founders of the Black Lives Matter movement in South Pasadena, has already been assaulted while protesting at Fair Oaks and Mission. This past July, Joe Richcreek, a career criminal who has been arrested over 30 times and prosecuted 20 times, yelled and spat on her and on the face of another protestor while holding a rock in one hand and a double-sided sharpened drummer's stick under his arm. Richcreek returned two days later, threatened James, and threw a rock at her. Richcreek had to be chased down and stalled by the protestors while they waited for police to arrive. We believe that Fahren James has become a target of systemic racism and a pattern of violence. We are deeply concerned for the safety of Fahren James and Black Lives Matter protestors and support their right to peaceful protest. It is absolutely crucial that community members are not endangered and have their right to free speech protected. We are frustrated that SPPD has not taken considerable action to address serious threats in our community. We demand that SPPD immediately address this situation more thoroughly and work directly with community groups to make departmental changes so that the police department is prepared to deal with any incidents in the future. We demand public report on all these incidents and want serious investigation because people's lives are in danger. We want the city to investigate and deeply scrutinize what is happening in order to have more protection in place.

On December 21, 2016, South Pasadena adopted Resolution 7491, a resolution of the City Council of the city of South Pasadena, California, affirming the city of South Pasadena's commitment to diversity and to safeguarding the civil rights, safety and dignity of all of our residents. We want to see our city show a real demonstration to exercise this resolution now.

The following outlines our specific demands:

- SPPD should investigate the October 3 truck attack as a hate crime, pursuant to Policy 319 of the [SPPD Policy Manual](#).
- SPPD should disclose all reports written by SPPD about the incident, including, but not limited to, notes from police officers who arrived at the scene and reports from subsequent investigation of this incident. Investigate the communications and interactions between Chief Ortiz and Richard Cheney. At the site of the October 3 truck attack, Cheney stated that he was calling Chief Ortiz and communicated to the person on the phone, "She's still putting the signs up. I am right here on the corner right now." We want to know if there is a relationship between Chief Ortiz and Cheney that allowed Cheney to not be cited and released without arrest.
- SPPD and the City of South Pasadena should properly archive the videos taken from the city cameras on the signals at Fair Oaks and Mission and have these videos accessible through a request for public records.
- SPPD should disclose its prevention and preparation plan for addressing hate crimes, as described in Policy 319 of the SPPD Policy Manual.
- The City Council should directly condemn white supremacist activities that threaten the safety of all residents and should also directly prohibit SPPD and its officers from engaging with white supremacist activities. The City Council should acknowledge the string of incidents that have occurred *in just the past five months* involving white supremacy: (1) [distribution of "It's OK to be White" flyers around the city in June 2020](#); (2) [finding of nails on the driveways of properties displaying Black Lives Matter signs in July 2020](#); (3) [SPPD officers' display of Blue Lives Matter propaganda in July 2020](#); (4) [the Joe Richcreek spitting incident against BLM protestors in July 2020](#); (5) [the attack of a protestor in August 2020](#); and (6) [Chief Ortiz's promotion of an event held by a white supremacist group in September 2020](#).

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Public Comment for Open Session of the October 7th Council Meeting

My name is Steve Zikman and I live on Fairview Avenue. Along with many other residents of South Pasadena, I was disgusted and very concerned that our city's Police Chief Ortiz sent out an invitation to the public to attend a prayer event run by the American Society for the Defense of Tradition, Family, and Property, a well-known, virulently anti-LGBT group. We are a two dad family who have lived in South Pas for 15 years. We need to feel safe here. While I understand that the event has now been postponed and the Police Chief has since apologized, I do have some reasonable follow-up questions which I hope Police Chief Ortiz will answer fully and truthfully if he really wants to “regain the trust and confidence of the residents of South Pasadena”:

- Why was Police Chief Ortiz in such “haste” to grant this group permission to use a public space for a private prayer session?
- Why did Police Chief Ortiz not do his due diligence? Why did he not ask the group who they were? If he did, why did he not investigate their background to determine (a) if they were a legitimate group, (b) whether they posed any threat to the citizens of South Pasadena; and (c) whether their views were consistent with the views and values of the City of South Pasadena? It would seem to be normal police procedure to make these inquiries. And, if not, it should be.
- Why did Police Chief Ortiz feel that he had to make this private prayer session a public event? Why did he invite only certain citizens of South Pas to the event, and not others?
- Given that Thursday September 24th was our new Interim City Manager Sean Joyce’s first day on the job, did Police Chief Ortiz apprise the City Manager of (a) his decision to let this group use public property to hold their meeting, and (b) his decision to invite members of the public?
- If Police Chief Ortiz did not inform Mr. Joyce, why not?
- If he did inform Mr. Joyce, what was Mr. Joyce’s response? Did he inform Mr. Joyce about the name of the group?
- Did anyone else raise concerns about this group before Police Chief Ortiz invited members of the public to this event?
- Why did Police Chief Ortiz in his invitation ask attendees to “refrain from using photos of our personnel as we welcome the community’s spiritual support”?

I ask these questions in good faith, and I do hope that Police Chief Ortiz will answer these questions by the end of this week in good faith in a spirit of transparency and trust.

He's also sophisticated enough to know he had to make an ICMA Ethics Code insurance move to secure his integrity. He did that while the Council wasn't paying attention. He anted up before the City Council sat down at the poker table.

Hold 'em, Baby.

When Mr. Joyce stated to Ben Tansey of *South Pasadenan* that he was assigning himself the task of proving how much money the City has – the City Treasurer failed in that -- and how well that money has been accounted for, *he put his professional intentions on public record before the City Council gave him specific direction. His intentions to apply best practice to these problems are non-negotiable, in other words.* He doubled down on the Council before his first city council meeting. Pure leadership.

The residents of Orange Grove Place, Orange Grove Ave., and El Centro St. have come together to share our concern regarding the request that 822 Orange Grove Place be removed from the South Pasadena Inventory of Cultural Resources. Although we chose to submit our letter as one, please note that had current conditions allowed, we would have made 21 individual comments, showing not only genuine concern but our dedication towards preservation of the area that we live in.

822 Orange Grove Place still preserves the basic features of a Craftsman style bungalow. This style of architecture is what defines much of the street and the surrounding areas and serves as a significant reminder of the city's social, educational, cultural, and architectural history.

These historic bungalows are important for South Pasadena to preserve, as they define the charm and appeal of the neighborhood. There are 4 other homes on Orange Grove Place. in addition to 822, that are classified with the 6L code, and roughly 900 other homes within the community.

We ask Council to consider that this house stands as one of many which could ultimately be lost. We ask that this home remain listed on the South Pasadena Inventory of Cultural Resources to preserve, maintain, and safeguard the city's heritage and character of our neighborhoods.
